Family and Children First Council

FCFC is a group of local agencies and community organizations that work together as partners to improve the well-being of children and families in Jackson County. In 2016, the Jackson County FCFC served **57** Families.

Emergency Preparedness

- The PHEP Grant develops and improves infrastructure to train, prepare for, and respond to emergencies and natural disasters.
- In 2016, the JCHD conducted a POD (Point of Dispensing) to provide Flu Shots to community members and also to exercise our department's capability to administer medication to a large number of people in a short period of time in case of an emergency.

Wellness Program

Each year the Wellness Program adds new and exciting programs and classes that will keep the Jackson County employees interested in keeping up with their overall well-being. The purpose of this program is to help keep healthcare costs down for employees.
